As a **school**, we will try our best to:

- contact you if there is a problem with attendance or punctuality.

- let you know of any concerns or problems that affect your child's work or behaviour whilst having a sympathetic understanding of the needs/concerns of your child while he/she is a pupil here.
- arrange parents' evenings during which the progress of your child will be discussed.
- provide homework in accordance with the school's homework policy.
- keep you informed about school activities through regular emails, newsletters and notices about special events.

As a **pupil** at Nash Mills, we would expect you to try your hardest to:

- always do the best that you can.
- be caring and supportive to those around you.
- encourage others in the school.
- come to school most days, unless you are poorly.
- come to school in the correct uniform or PE kit.
- tell an adult of any concerns or worries you have so that they can help you.
- obey the Golden Rules.

follow adult instructions so that you can keep safe online.
To tell an adult if you see anything that worries you.

As a parent at Nash Mills, we would expect you to:

- demonstrate the caring and compassionate values that we expect within school.
- encourage your child to show kindness to others.
- let the school know about any concerns or problems that might affect your child's work or behaviour.
- fully support the school's behaviour policy and school rules.
- see that your child attends school regularly, on time and in school uniform and meeting the requirements for correct PE kit.
- encourage your child to be as independent as possible with belongings and work.
- inform the school as soon as possible of the reason for your child's absence.
- let the school know if you are worried or concerned about something, rather than placing this on social media or externally, so that we can try to help.
- support and encourage your child's homework and other opportunities for home learning.
- attend parents' evenings and discussions about your child's life at school.
- inform the school if another adult is collecting your child from school.

Our Online Safety Agreement

I will only use school IT equipment for activities agreed with staff.

I will not tell anyone other than my parents/carers my passwords. I will not use other people's usernames or passwords to pretend to be them online.

I will make sure that all online contact I make is responsible, polite and sensible. I will be kind and respectful at all times.

If I come across anything upsetting, unpleasant or nasty, or anything that makes me feel unsafe, I will tell my teacher or my parent/carer immediately.

I will not give out my own or other people's personal information. I will tell my teacher or parent/carer if anyone asks me online for personal information.

Even if I have permission, I will not upload any images, videos, sounds or words that **could** upset, now or in the future, any member of the school community, as this is cyberbullying.

I understand that some people on the internet are not who they say they are and some people are not safe to be in contact with. I will not arrange to meet someone I only know on the internet. If someone asks to meet me, I will not reply to them and I will tell a teacher or a parent/carer immediately.

I understand that everything I do or receive online can be traced now and in the future. I know it is important to build a good online reputation.

I understand my behaviour in the virtual classroom should mirror that in the physical classroom.

I will not lie about my age in order to access games, apps or social networks that are for older people as this will put me at risk.

I understand that these rules are designed to keep me safe now and in the future. If I break the rules my teachers will look into it and may need to take action.
