

- A habitat is a place where living things, such as animals and plants, can find all of the things they need to survive. This includes food, water, air, space to move and grow and some shelter.
- Some habitats are large, like the ocean, and some are very small, such as under a log.
- A very small habitat, for example where mini-beasts live under a log, is called a microhabitat.
- Some habitats in our local area include the canal and woodlands. Other habitats include the coast and the forest.

Food Chains

- Animals and plants depend on each other to survive. For example, worms depend on plants because they feed on dead leaves, but plants depend on worms who make the soil healthy by digging holes and allowing air in.
- Birds also need worms because they eat them. Worms • are a source of food for birds. This called a food chain and can be shown using a diagram like the one below.



If there were no worms, there would be fewer birds • as there would be more competition for food. The soil would not be as healthy without worms.

Biome	A very large natural area where animals and plants live due to the weather and climate conditions.
Carnivore	An animal that eats meat.
Detritivore	An animal that eats things that have died, mostly plant material.
Habitat	A natural place where an animal or plant normally lives.
Herbivore	An animal that only eats plants.
Invertebrate	An animal that does not have a backbone.
Omnivore	An animal that eats plants and meat.
Vertebrate	An animal that has a backbone.
